From page 16 - 'Arsenic is found in wall-papers and in the new Japanese paper hangings; in materials for dress, in curtains and curtain-linings; in ornamental feathers, artificial flowers, lampshades, fly-papers, and in a variety of other materials - all more or less impregnating the atmosphere of our houses with poison.' Certain conspiracy theorists have used this in recent years to propose that Napoleon was murdered by deliberately colouring his wallpaper with arsenic.*

*\*GOLTZ [1834-1902], occupied positions in the Universities of Königsberg and Halle before taking the chair in physiology in Strassburg in 1872. His early work on decerebrate and spinally ablated frogs initiated the modern study of reflexology, and together with other pioneer work by Sechenov in Russia, continued the neurophysiology of Johannes Müller and Marshall Hall. Many of his early demonstrations of the effect of neuro-damage in frogs began with the Beeton-esque statement - 'Take two frogs...', and he was able to show that decerebrate frogs would remain motionless when left alone but would respond by moving and croaking when stimulated. His work with mammals began in 1874, on dogs, though he always intended to extend his research into the human condition. Eventually and after a series of increasingly extensive cerebral ablations in dogs, he concluded that 'I will prove beyond the shadow of a doubt that Ferrier's theory [of localization of function] is completely false'. His dispute with Ferrier came to a head [literally] at the Seventh International Congress of Medicine in 1881, the year of publication of the above text. Goltz's demonstrations were convincing but although accepting the results, Ferrier denied Goltz's conclusions. He thought Goltz's dissections were too crude and showed two of his own experiments, upon monkeys. Both series were examined by committee, which included Yeo and Gowers, concluding that Goltz had left intact certain areas of motor and sensory function and that Ferrier had sufficiently demonstrated that brain localization was indeed an existent fact. From 1871 he attended the City of London School but playing truant for several weeks, he was sent to a private school, the Alexandra Park College, on leaving which he worked for six months in an insurance office, followed by taking his articles with a consulting analyst in the City for three years. At the age of twenty, on a small legacy from his paternal grandfather, Hopkins enrolled at the Royal School of Mines, taking a course in chemistry under Edward Frankland. After a brief period working with Frankland's son Percy, he studied for the associateship of the Institute of Chemistry at University College, London. *DAVY [1778-1829], was a formidable autodidact, he read his first book on chemistry in 1796 and was lecturing in the subject at the Royal Institution in 1801. See DSB - 'In an early essay (1799), Davy attacked Lavoisier's caloric theory for introducing imaginary substances and the theory-laden term 'caloric'.... Of all those who worked on Volta's pile, Davy was consistently the clearest-headed. From the first he held to the chemical reaction theory of electricity production, and ultimately proved that the current in the electrolytic cells separated compounds into components and did not synthesize new substances. He invented the carbon arc [figure 18, plate 3, above]...[He] disproved Lavoisier's theory that oxygen was the principle of acidity. In the course of experiments he isolated and described many of the properties of potassium and sodium (1807). He then analyzed the alkaline earths, isolating magnesium, calcium, strontium and barium, and obtained boron and silicon. He established that chemical elements do not behave as 'principles' of acidity or alkalinity and concluded that chemical properties were a function of the relative arrangements as well as of the components of a substance. Davy showed that oxygen was never produced in reactions with oxymuriatic acid unless water was present, placed oxymuriatic acid among the elements, and named it 'chlorine'. He elucidated the nature and essential properties of iodine.'*

It is part of the series describing his travels in the Philippines - Reisen im Archipel der Philippinen (Zweiter Theil, Dritter Band), and in it Semper investigated the photoreceptors found in the pulmonate Mollusca, genus Onchidium, concluding that their embryological development provides a phylogenetic link with the vertebrate eye. He was an advocate for direct environmental influence on the anatomy of organisms, disagreeing with Darwin on the matter. His 1880 publication 'Die natürlichen Existenzbedingungen der Thiere' was translated into English for the International Scientific Series, in 1881. He had sent Darwin the German proof sheets.*
