*\*A remarkably comprehensive survey of the extraction, purification and application in medicine, of radium. The folding plates illustrate many pieces of surgical apparatus, whilst other plates show a variety of technical apparatus.*

4. **BOER WAR. AMBULANCE CREW** at the Kimberley Siege : Two albumen print group photographs of the Ambulance Men - 1. A group of 13 men in uniform, wide brimmed hats, Red Cross armbands on their left arms, knapsacks over their shoulders, a 14th. central figure in civilian clothes without armband or knapsack, presumably a doctor, behind him with her left hand on his shoulder is a young girl, on the ground in front of them, three stretchers. There is no photographer's credit nor place nor date. SIZE : 12.7 x 10.5 cms.  
2. A larger group of 51 men, dressed as above, but with a smaller Red Cross insignia on the right arm rather than on the left, the same figure of the doctor is in the centre of the group. At the lower edge is written - 'Siege of Kimberley Ambulance Men'. With the imprint of J. E. MIDDLEBROOK, Kimberley (Opposite the Club). SIZE : 21.5 x 14.8 cms.

Both on card mounts, worn at the edges, stained and grubby, the larger somewhat faded. £250

*\*The Siege of Kimberley lasted from 14th. October 1899 until the 15th. of February 1900. An internet search revealed a family blog written by Richard Symonds, providing the verbatim account of life under siege written by his ancestor, HENRY SYMONDS, to his brother. Henry had trained as a physician, acquired his MRCS, and had emigrated to South Africa at the beginning of the 1890s. In 1899, working as physician in the Kimberley diamond mines for Cecil Rhodes, he was caught up in the siege. His letters are addressed from the Kimberley Club, situated opposite Middlebrook's photographic studio, and in the first of the series, he writes : 'A well-organized town guard had been ready for some time before, and on the eventful Sunday we really did expect an attack and everybody stood to arms all day. I belong to an ambulance detachment and am located at a certain spot with 3 stretchers and 14 men, ready in case of emergency. Mine is a soft job compared with the fighting men.....'.*

*The smaller of the above photographs does indeed show 14 men, himself included, and the three stretchers. The young girl in the picture is surely Symonds's daughter - he had married in Kimberley in 1892 and had seven children, of which five daughters [I am grateful to Richard Symonds for permission to use the above information taken from his blog].*

*\*SARAH ACLAND [1815-1878], philanthropist and wife of Sir Henry Acland, physician. Following her death, her friends gathered a subscription with which they founded The Sarah Acland Institution for Nurses in Oxford. It was opened in 1879, and over the years expanded to become the Sarah Acland Hospital. The site in Banbury Road, Oxford was sold to Keble College in 2004, the hospital moving to Headington, next to the John Radcliffe Hospital, and renamed the Manor Hospital.*

*\*Extremely scarce as a complete set of first editions - see GARRISON-MORTON 4920.1, for the 4th. edition in which Cullen introduced the term 'neuroses', chapter III, Of Hypochondriasis. Cullen was the most celebrated teacher of medicine in the eighteenth century and one of the first to employ clinical lectures.*

On page 20, he wrote - 'I well remember, that the catarrhal Fever, which spread through all Europe under the Name of Influenza in the Spring, 1743, frequently became pleuritic, or peripneumonic.....'. At the end of the work is the Appendix - 'A Method of preserving the Health of Seamen in long Cruises and Voyages.' The Dissertation on diphtheria, above added, was first published separately in 1757.*

After the original was published, Koch succeeded in photographing his microscopical preparations and sent them to Lister. The translator saw these preparations, and also stained sections obtained directly from Koch, and confirms that the Plates are accurate likenesses.'*

Vast in scope, it is one of the most fundamentally important works in the history of medicine.'*
